

Gary Gershony, MD, FACC, FSCAI



Dr. Gershony grew up in Toronto, Canada and attended the University of Toronto where he graduated from medical school in 1979 at age 23. Dr. Gershony completed his training in Interventional Cardiology at Emory University in Atlanta under the auspices of Dr. Andreas Grüntzig, the inventor of percutaneous transluminal angioplasty. From 1993-1997, Dr. Gershony was Director of the Cardiac Catheterization Laboratories and Interventional Cardiology at the University of California, Davis, Medical Center. For the past 10 years he has been practicing Interventional Cardiology at John Muir Medical Center in the San Francisco Bay Area.

Dr. Gershony is the Co-Founder and Chief Medical Officer of AngioScore, Inc. (Fremont, CA), a medical device company that has developed a unique angioplasty scoring catheter (AngioSculpt®) for use during coronary and peripheral interventional procedures. AngioScore markets the AngioSculpt in the U.S, Europe, Japan, Israel and many other countries. Dr. Gershony was also the principal inventor of the Duett™ Vascular Sealing Device which is manufactured by Vascular Solutions, Inc. (Minneapolis, MN), a publicly traded medical device company founded by Dr. Gershony in 1996 and for whom he served as Chief Medical Officer and a member of the Board of Directors from 1996-2002. Dr. Gershony has also served on the adjunct faculty of the Stanford Biodesign Innovation Program and has been a medical advisor or consultant for numerous medical device companies in the Bay Area and Minneapolis.

Dr. Gershony is board certified in Interventional Cardiology and is a Fellow of the American College of Cardiology, the American Heart Association and the Society for Cardiovascular Angiography and Interventions. Dr. Gershony has published over 90 articles and abstracts in the field of cardiology, has authored 7 issued medical device patents and has lectured widely on the latest treatments for heart disease.
